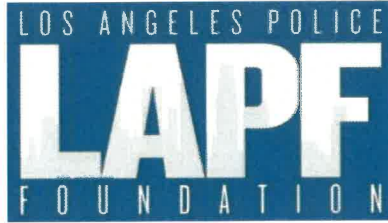

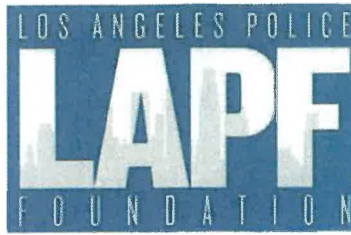

Purchase of (7) Soft Ballistic Shield:

LAPD/FBI Fugitive Task Force and LAPD/US Marshal Task Force locates violent offenders most of which are wanted for murder. We conduct surveillance and once located we tactically deploy to affect the arrest. We have examined these situations and determined a soft ballistic shield is portable and pliable while also providing protection from most common small arm calibers. We are requesting to purchase to use during tactical scenarios in the field such as: laying over the windshields and door panels of our vehicle for additional cover, draping over railings to provide cover at limited access areas (i.e. apartments or motels), to cover windows as entry teams approach locations such as houses, apartments or motel rooms where there are limited areas of cover. This equipment would greatly improve officer safety.

NAME OF REQUEST: TEST AND EVALUATION OF PORTABLE SHIELD

It is requested that Gang and Narcotics Division be approved to test and evaluate a soft ballistic shield. The soft shield would be purchased through private grant. Approval of this grant benefits the Department as follows:

Gang and Narcotics Division (GND) has two squads that focus on apprehending violent offenders most of which are wanted for murder, attempt murder, robbery, and rape. The LAPD/FBI Fugitive Task Force (FBIFTF) consists of (9) LAPD detectives from GND, (4) Police Officers from Metropolitan Division, (2) FBI Agents, and (1) Parole Officer. The LAPD/United States Marshals Apprehension Task Force (USMATF) consists of (11) LAPD Investigators, (2) Police Officers from Metropolitan Division, and (1) U.S. Marshals Agent.

Our arrests significantly impact the clearance rates for homicide units in each of the four bureaus. The unprecedented number of arrests of violent and often career criminals and gang members has most definitely had a dramatic effect on preventing additional violent crimes, shootings and murders within the city of Los Angeles. During many of these arrests, we encounter armed suspects who are attempting to evade capture. However, during the past several years we have had six armed encounters which resulted in officer involved shootings. During one incident, an FBI Agent sustained a gunshot wound to his arm from the suspect's gunfire. Over the past three years, our two teams have arrested more than 1,300 violent suspects, of which 620 were wanted for murder, and recovered over 400 firearms. Due to the violent suspects we encounter on a daily basis, I am respectfully requesting additional ballistic protection for officers during our arrest operations as this equipment can mitigate harm and improve officer safety and the ultimate outcomes during operations.

I have attached a description of the soft ballistic shield from Point Blank Level IIIA Armor, which is a portable ballistic armor product. The soft shield would provide additional cover for operators during tactical situations where there are limited areas that provide cover. We are requesting to purchase then test and evaluate product during tactical scenarios in the field, such as: laying over the windshields and door panels of our vehicle for additional cover, draping over railings to provide cover at limited access areas (i.e. apartments or motels), to cover windows as entry teams approach locations such as houses, apartments or motel rooms where there are limited areas of cover.

Attached is the quote from "Galls" which is an approved Department vendor for uniforms and equipment.

These requested items will incur no operational or maintenance costs.

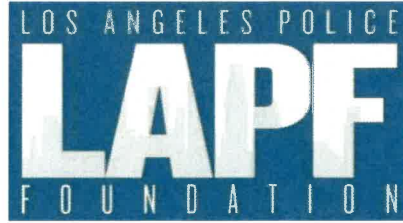

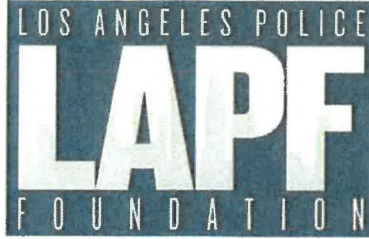

The Russ Urban Swim Program has been active in Pacific Area for eleven years. In that period, the program has assisted hundreds of children in our youth programs to learn how to swim and increase water safety for them.

This year, the program is planned to start on June 20, 2023, and we will again use a local area pool. The City-wide Aquatics Division of Recreation and Parks has agreed to provide swim instructors (total of 2) as well as separate on-duty lifeguards. The lifeguards and swim staff are all CPR certified as well as the police officers that will be attending this activity. All minor children will have their parent/legal guardian complete a medical waiver and parental consent form prior to attending the program. Furthermore, all minor children will have a medical physical signed by a doctor.

Pacific Area requests funds of \$20,000.00 from our Russ Urban Swim Program Endowment with the Los Angeles Police Foundation to cover the costs associated with the 2023 summer swim program and future program years. The funds in general will pay for associated costs including; the pool, swim suits, a swim party, awards, and food for the swim party. The Los Angeles Police Foundation will continue to hold and disperse monies as needed for the program.


