SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR PAYMENT OF REWARD OFFERS ON CITY COUNCIL

FILE NO. 09-0010-S9 AND NO.10-0010-S20.

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners (Board) REVIEW and APPROVE the attached Application for Special Reward Payment.

2. That the Board TRANSMIT to the Mayor and City Council the Application for Special Reward Payment for review and approval.

DISCUSSION

On December 11, 2008, the bodies of 43-year-old Khachik Safaryan and his 8-year-old daughter Lusine Safaryan were discovered shot to death inside their Hollywood Apartment, located at 1227 Tamarind Avenue.

On January 30, 2009 a \$75,000 reward was offered on a motion approved by the Los Angeles City Council for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the deaths of Khachik Safaryan and Lusine Safaryan. The crimes remained unsolved for the next 17 months.

On March 26, 2010, the wife of Khachik Safaryan was discovered shot to death inside her vehicle parked in the carport, behind 5850 Lexington Avenue.

On April 13, 2010, the Los Angeles City Council reinstated the \$75,000 reward for an additional six months. Detectives also requested a \$50,000 reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Karine Hakobyan. The request was approved by the City Council on May 5, 2010.

On April 19 and May 11, 2010, a witness came forward with information which led to the recovery of one of the murder weapons as well as information identifying Alberd Tersargsyan as the person responsible for all three homicides. The witness also provided information which was used to further prove Tersargsyan's involvement in a fourth murder, the murder of Julie Kates, who was killed on March 11, 2010.

Albert Tersargsyan, aka Albert Huratunyan was charged with four counts of murder under Case No. BA370872.

On August 23, 2011, the witness testified before the Grand Jury of the Los Angeles County, Reference No GJ11-12/08. The defendant Alberd Tersargsyan, AKA Albert Huratunyan was indicted on four counts of 187 (a) PC, Murder with Special Circumstances.

Over the next several years the witness made himself available to the investigative team, including the prosecutors from the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office.

On March 26, 2018, the trial in The People of the State of California vs Albert Huratunyan, Case No. BA 382886, began with jury selection. The witness again made himself available and was scheduled to testify on April 12, 2018.

On April 1, 2018, at 0330 hours, the defendant Albert Huratunyan committed suicide while housed in the Los Angeles County jail.

It is the opinion of the investigating officer and the deputy district attorneys assigned to this case, that the testimony provided by the witness resulted in the arrest and subsequent indictment on four counts of murder against the defendant. It is also the opinion of the investigative team that the testimony of the witness would have resulted in a guilty verdict being returned by the jury.





On March 26, 2010 at 8:20 pm, a murder was reported to police in the 5800 block of Lexington Avenue in Hollywood. The victim, Karine Hakobyan, was shot to death inside her vehicle which was parked under the carport behind her apartment building. Ms. Hakobyan's 14 year-old daughter, who was waiting for her mother to come home from work, went to check the carport and discovered her mother in the vehicle. Further, in a separate incident on December 11, 2008, Ms. Hakobyan's husband and 8 year-old daughter were brutally murdered in their home. This unthinkable tragedy has left Ms. Hakobyan's daughter without her mother, father and sister. Detectives believe that people were in the area at the time the crime occurred and may have information that will assist in the investigation. Detectives hope that a monetary reward compels the public to provide more information.

The person or persons responsible for this crime represent an ongoing threat to the safety of the people of Los Angeles; therefore, it is appropriate for the City of Los Angeles to offer a reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Karine Hakobyan.

ITHEREFORE MOVE that by adoption of this Motion, the City Council provide an offer of reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension, and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Karine Hakobyan, a resident of the City of Los Angeles, on March 26, 2010, and in support thereof, make the following findings pursuant to Division 19, Chapter 12, Article 1 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code:

- 1. That the death of Karine Hakobyan was caused by the willful misconduct of one or more persons.
- 2. That this offer of reward is consistent with and taken for the immediate protection of the public peace, health and safety of local residents, as well as visitors to the City, and is consistent with the need to arrest and convict the person or persons who, because of not being apprehended, could by their actions further terrorize and present a continuing and immediate menace to the rights of persons in the City.
- 3. That what happened to Karine Hakobyan, is an especially disturbing crime and therefore, as a matter of public policy, the City hereby offers a reward as an added inducement for persons to come forward with information leading to the identification, apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Karine Hakobyan.
- 4. That the sum of \$50,000 shall be the aggregate maximum sum of any payment or payments of a City reward in this instance.
- 5. That the offer of reward shall be in effect for six months from the date of the advertisement of the reward by the City Clerk.

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Clerk be directed to cause notices and/or advertisements to be duly published according to the requirements of Division 19, Chapter 12, Article 1 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, and to thereby cause the offer of reward to become effective.
