# COMMISSION INVESTIGATION DIVISION APRIL 2012 ACTIVITY REPORT

## **ENFORCEMENT SECTION**

## Audit & Inspection Unit

During the month of April, the Audit and Inspection Unit (AIU) conducted six Official Police Garage (OPG) off-hours inspections. Night-time lighting, security of personal property and evidentiary storage areas were examined. No significant discrepancies were identified.

On April 12, CID personnel met with Fiscal Operation Division personnel to discuss processing and payment of Order Release/Reimbursement Requests.

On April 26, CID personnel met at Department of Transportation (DOT), with Valley Division supervisors, to discuss impounding/tow procedures relating to illegally parked billboards and the vehicles towing them.

## Café Entertainment And Shows (CES)

In the month of April, CES investigators provided training to West Los Angeles and Rampart area vice units on CID's support role for Vice Units in the compliant/disciplinary process of CES/Adult Entertainment and Massage Therapist permits. CES investigators will continue to provide training to Citywide vice units.

### **Uniform Enforcement Section/Parking Lot Enforcement**

During the month of April, Uniform Enforcement Section officers conducted approximately 57 upfront auto park inspections.

### Noise Enforcement Team (NET)

During the month of April, the NET completed 23 noise variances. To date a total of 54 variances have been completed.

NET officers continue to liaison with the Metro Project coordinators on the ongoing rail system variance project in the Downtown area.

### Advocate Section/Police Permit Review Panel

During the month of April, the Police Permit Review Panel referred a Café Entertainment/Shows applicant to a formal hearing, revoked one Massage Therapist/Off-Premises permit, and accepted and adopted a Stipulation Settlement for a Secondhand Auto Parts permit application. The Panel also accepted the withdrawal of a Secondhand Jewelry permit application.

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## PERMITS AND RECORDS SECTION

### **Training**

Staff conducted a special training for the Office of Finance on Auto Park permits. The training covered information given to permit applicants as well as information about the inspection of parking lots and enforcement of City laws. City Attorney Brian Sottile, assigned to CID, responded to legal questions during the training.

### **Meeeting with Autopark**

Permit Staff along with the City Attorney and Enforcement Section had a meeting to review 28 autopark applications from a single applicant. It appeared the applicant may have been a shell corporation hiding a previous permittee with revoked permits. After the Enforcement Section and Permit Staff met with the applicant, they agreed to withdraw the applications.

### **Records Requests**

Staff made one court appearance in Van Nuys on a case involving an unpermitted massage business.

Staff made one court appearance in Van Nuys on a case involving an unpermitted massage therapist.

4 record requests were processed.

2 public records requests were processed.

## **CHARITABLE SERVICES SECTION (CSS)**

#### **Bingo Monitoring**

On April 25, CSS staff met with the Principal and a bingo volunteer of Divine Savior Catholic Church & School, a newly licensed bingo organization, to provide them with pre-opening bingo training. CSS staff discussed with the school principal and bingo volunteer the provisions of the Bingo Ordinance and City Rules and Regulations in regards to bingo accounting, financial control systems and reporting, and the proper condition of the bingo venue during conduct of bingo games. The requirement to comply strictly with the rule of maintaining a bank account exclusive for bingo was emphasized to the officers of the bingo club.

### <u>Other</u>

On April 12, CSS received a Notice of Intention Application (NOI) from the Los Angeles Tuskegee Alumni Association, Inc. (Tuskegee) for a July Fundraiser Event. A Letter of Information Card 'Denial' was sent to Tuskegee as a result of it being on SUSPENDED status The Honorable Board of Police Commissioners Page 3 1.0

with the Secretary of State. CSS will monitor the organization to determine if gains an ACTIVE status prior to its event. Will follow-up with Enforcement Section if necessary on day of event to determine compliance with the City's Solicitation Ordinance.

On April 23, a Cease and Desist Letter was sent to VKGS LLC, Video King because of its failure to renew its Bingo Supplier license which expired on April 20, 2012. CSS received the company's completed renewal application form and the renewal fee of \$100 on April 26, 2013 and was subsequently issued a supplier license valid up to April 20, 2013
