RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners REVIEW and APPROVE the BolaWrap Remote Restraint Device Pilot Extension.

On February 5, 2020 the 180-day BolaWrap Remote Restraint Device (BolaWrap) pilot program was authorized. As of August 10, 2020, the BolaWrap has been utilized nine times. Due to an insufficient sample size, an additional 180 days is needed in order to evaluate the effectiveness of the device.

It is requested that an additional 180 days be approved to continue to evaluate the BolaWrap for effectiveness. All existing BolaWrap Restraint Device procedures will remain in effect. Attached to this document is a matrix that identifies the nine incidents in which the Bola Wrap was deployed and the results of each deployment.
