

- West Pico Boulevard @ Fox Hills Drive - Southbound
- South Beverly Glen Boulevard @ Keswick Avenue - Eastbound
- West Pico Boulevard @ Kerwood Avenue - Northbound
- West Olympic Boulevard @ Fox Hills Drive - Northbound
- West Olympic Boulevard @ South Beverly Glen Boulevard - Northbound
- South Beverly Glen Boulevard @ Almayo Avenue - Eastbound
- South Beverly Glen Boulevard @ Ilona Avenue - Eastbound
- South Beverly Glen Boulevard @ Tennessee Avenue - Eastbound
- West Olympic Boulevard @ Benicia Avenue - Southbound

- West Olympic Boulevard @ Benicia Avenue - Northbound
- South Beverly Glen Boulevard @ Mississippi Avenue - Eastbound
- La Grange Avenue @ Benicia Avenue - Eastbound
- Kerwood Avenue @ West Olympic Boulevard - Northbound
- Kerwood Avenue @ West Olympic Boulevard - Southbound
- Lauriston Avenue @ Calvin Avenue - Northbound
